Rev. Alfred Stone was called to be pastor at the Trade River Evangelical Free Church, Grantsburg, Wisconsin, in 1910. He was pastor there from January, 1911 until June, 1913. He was the first resident pastor. On May 3, 1911 the congregation decided that a parsonage was to be built. It was to measure 22 x 26. During the time that Alfred was the pastor at the Trade River Evangelical Free Church, he was married. On August 23, 1911, Alfred and Julia Thompson were united in marriage at Julia's home in Detroit Lakes, MN. After they were married, they moved into the parsonage. Their son, Merle Vernon, was born on December 8, 1912.
