## Julia's Later Years

Iola's husband Don came home from the service in the fall of 1945. Don and Iola lived in an apartment in Milaca and then had a home and a garage built. They fixed up the garage so that they could live in it until their home was finished. When Alfred and Julia moved back to Milaca after being in Mamre, they lived in an upstairs apartment in the southern part of Milaca. When Don and Iola's home was ready to be moved into, Alfred and Julia lived in the fixed up garage. Alfred lived there until he passed away in 1949. Julia lived there until Don and Iola and their family moved to Golden Valley in 1955. Then Julia moved to an apartment in Milaca. Later, Julia lived with Don and Iola and their family in their home in Minnetonka. The last place that she lived was a Nursing Home in Minnetonka. She lived there until she passed away in 1971.
